Definitions	
Rosh Hashanah	the Jewish New Year festival, held on the first (also sometimes the second) day of Tishri (in September). It is marked by the blowing of the shofar, and begins the ten days of penitence culminating in Yom Kippur.
Yon Kipper	the most solemn religious fast of the Jewish year, the last of the ten days of penitence that begin with Rosh Hashanah (the Jewish New Year). Also called Day of Atonement.
Stubenälteste	German for "room official."
dysentery	infection of the intestines resulting in severe diarrhea with the presence of blood and mucus in the feces.
Muselman	meaning Muslim: was a slang term used among captives of World War II Nazi concentration camps to refer to those suffering from a combination of starvation (known also as "hunger disease") and exhaustion and who were resigned to their impending death.
